She thanked hospitality chair Anne Marie Schrubbe and Katina Kelsey, Tutt Hoy and Joan Acres for providing refreshments. She announced that the Historian/Photographer position has been filled by Jim Noonan.

Treasurer Elva Morin reported that the current account balance as of October 31 is \$3,990.58. Carolyn Koup reported for membership chair Kathy Kutschera that the Art Guild now has 109 members.

Mary Kay Bogardus indicated that she is accepting registrations for the Sandra Washburn Mixed Media workshop, which will be held February 4-6 at Chota Recreation Center. Classes will begin in January, and she asked that those who are interested please contact individual instructors.
