

It is official; my Fine Art Photography class University of Tennessee is a go for the Fall. After approval last Spring, the University, in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, closed the conference center where the certificate photography classes are held. The Fine Art Photography class will now be offered remotely via Zoom.

Date and Time: The class meets 6:30 PM to 9 PM for 6 Wednesday evening sessions (October 7,14, 21,28 and November 4 and 11, 2020). There will also be a Saturday field session (date and time TBD).

Course Description: “Fine art photography is born when a photographer is driven to create not just the image he or she sees but also the feelings associated with the image. This new course places a strong emphasis on expanding your creativity and visionary skills, encouraging you to try new techniques and use old techniques in new ways. You'll learn to define and refine your style. Throughout the course, you'll have assigned readings, participate in interesting and challenging team assignments (giving you an in-depth exposure to your team members' different approaches to photography), and create team presentations about your individual and collective works. We'll also cover a brief history of fine art photography and its pioneers, the challenges that the pioneers had to overcome, examples of contemporary fine art photographers, information on how to create a faithful following, and how to sell and market your works”.
